# A. Minutes – February 14, 2019

• <u>Parsons</u> motioned to approve the minutes from the February 14, 2019 meeting as written. <u>Foley</u> seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

# **B.** Working Group Updates

- <u>Sanderson</u> shared that he is speaking with experts about the ULC bill and will be setting up a working group call.
- Quigley and <u>Kintner</u> talked about the possibility of setting up a banking services bill (similar to the one Wyoming just passed) during this legislative session. Timing will be difficult for this session but could be a priority for next session.
- <u>Persky</u> and <u>Patty Salazar</u> shared that they will be working on setting up a banking services roundtable.
- <u>Persky</u> announced that Digital Token Act rulemaking will be taking place over the coming months and so community members should look out for invitations to participate.
- <u>Parsons</u> shared that Denver will be piloting a blockchain voting problem. This could serve as a model for government use cases because it was a real problem, had a government sponsor, and went through a focused RFP process.

# C. Outside Updates

• <u>Dan Shields</u> shared that there is a team working to propose a blockchain solution for GoCode Colorado. He will send more details via Slack and anyone who would like to join should reach out.
