

## DECLARATION OF COLORADO RESIDENCY

Each production company applying for a Performance-based incentive distribution must present proof that at least 50% of its employees are Colorado residents lawfully working in the United States. Using this form, during the course of production activities the production company must maintain records of all Colorado residents employed on the production. These forms must be submitted with the Film Incentive Proof of Performance and for review by the Colorado CPA. Each production company must maintain these records for a period of 24 months that establish an employee's proof of residency.

Colorado Residency Requirements
To be considered a Colorado resident you must own or operate a business in Colorado, be gainfully employed in Colorado, or have resided in Colorado for 90 consecutive days. In order to establish proof of residence you must possess a driver's license, identification card or a voter identification card issued by the State of Colorado. A copy of the appropriate document must be attached to this form.
