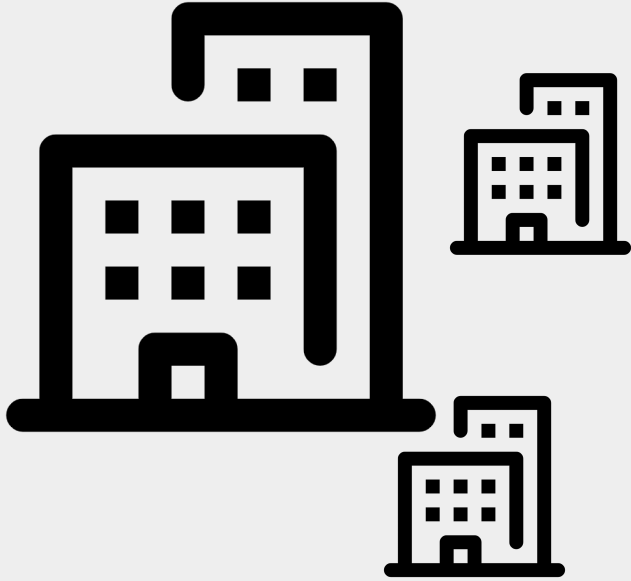


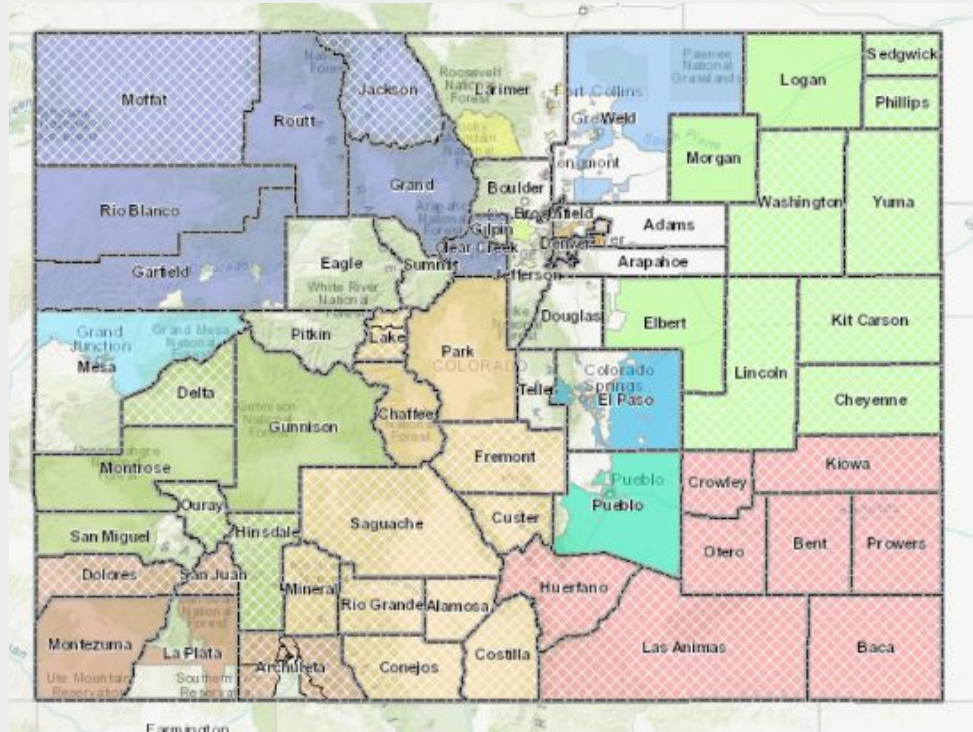
Venture Capital Authority - Urban Areas of Focus



The VCA aims to invest 25% of its enterprise fund in urban distressed communities also known as Colorado's urban enterprise zones.

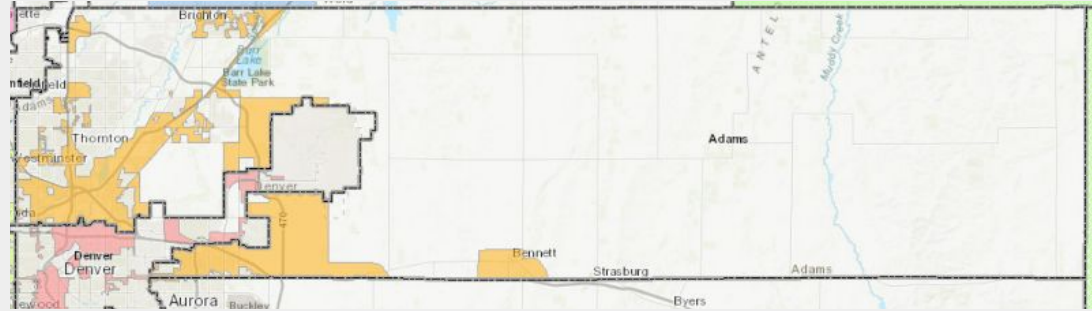

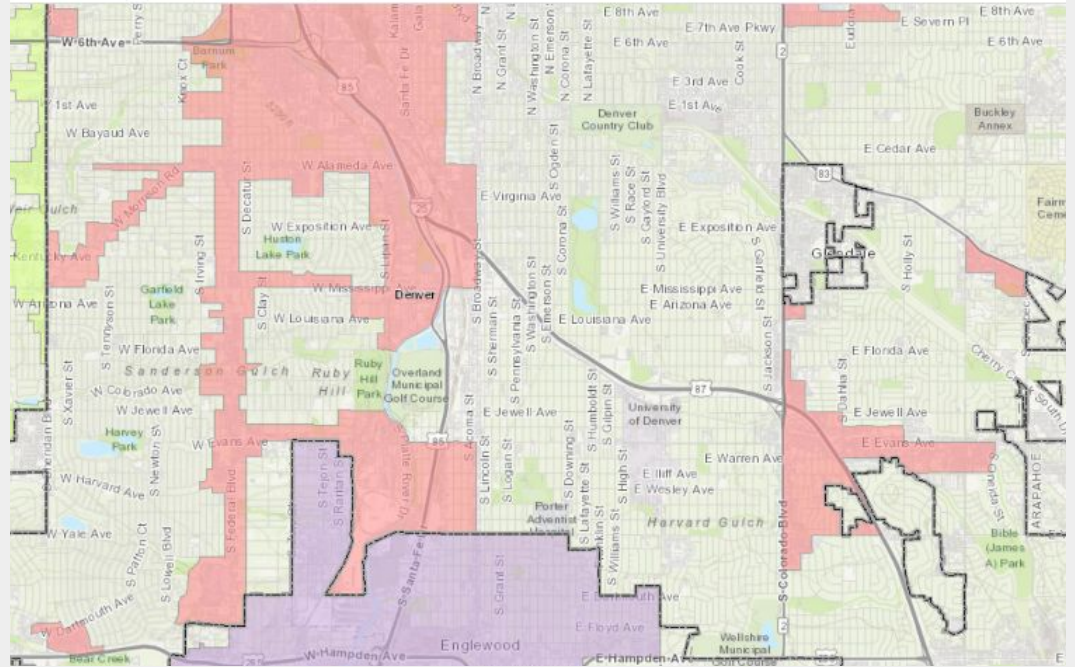
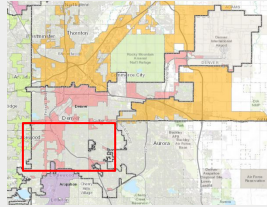
The Denver EZ wraps the City's northern boundaries and extends to its western boundaries paralleling I-70 and the north I-25 corridor. The City of Denver ensures its target neighborhoods are aligned with the Denver EZ and include: East Colfax, Globeville, Elyria-Swansea, Montbello, Northeast Park Hill, Sun Valley, Valverde, Villa Park, West Colfax, and Westwood. Additional EZ locations include portions of the following communities: Regis, Gateway/Green Valley Ranch, Clayton, Cole, Five Points, Auraria, Civic Center, Lincoln Park, City Park West, Hale, Baker, Athmar Park, College View/South Platte, Overland, E. Evans, Hampden South and most of the Federal Blvd corridor.



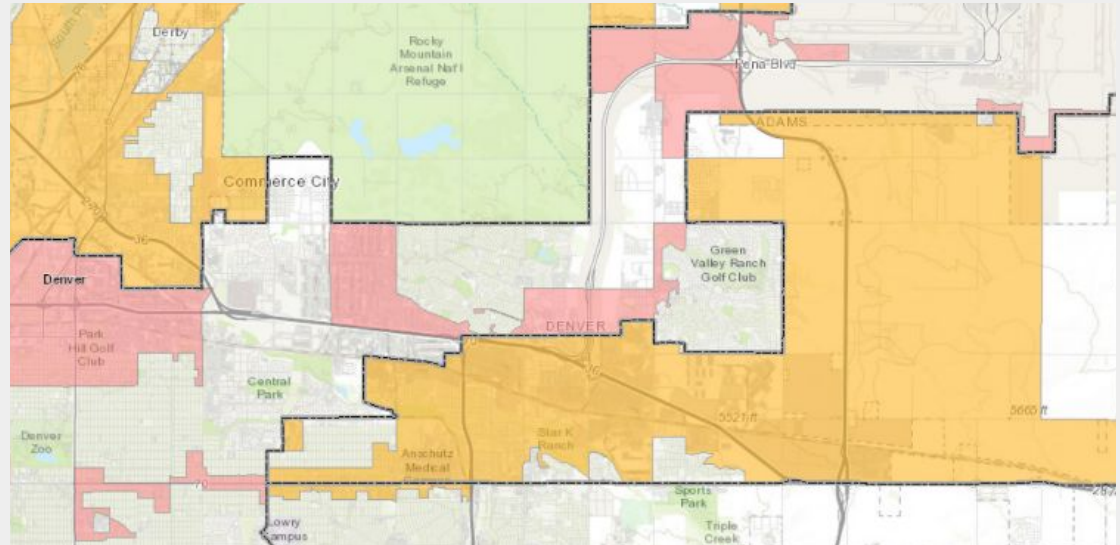
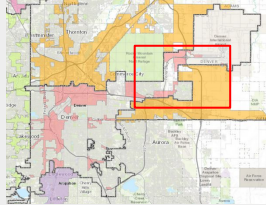

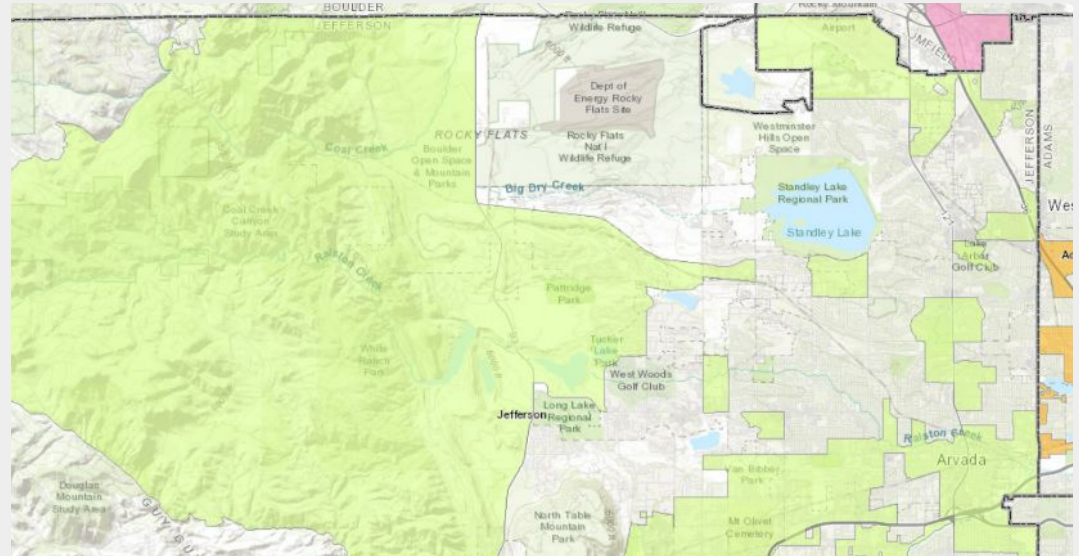
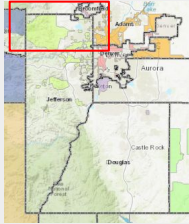


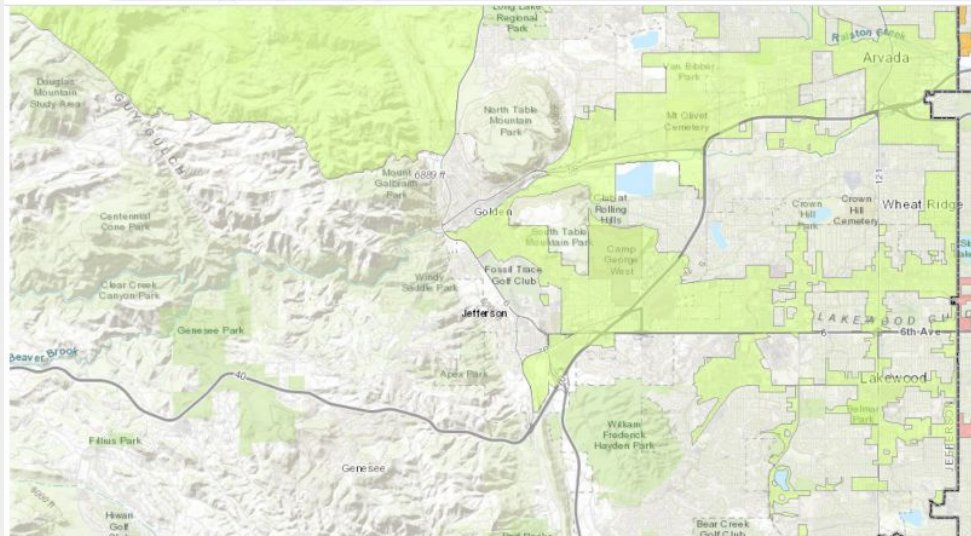
Jefferson County Enterprise Zone

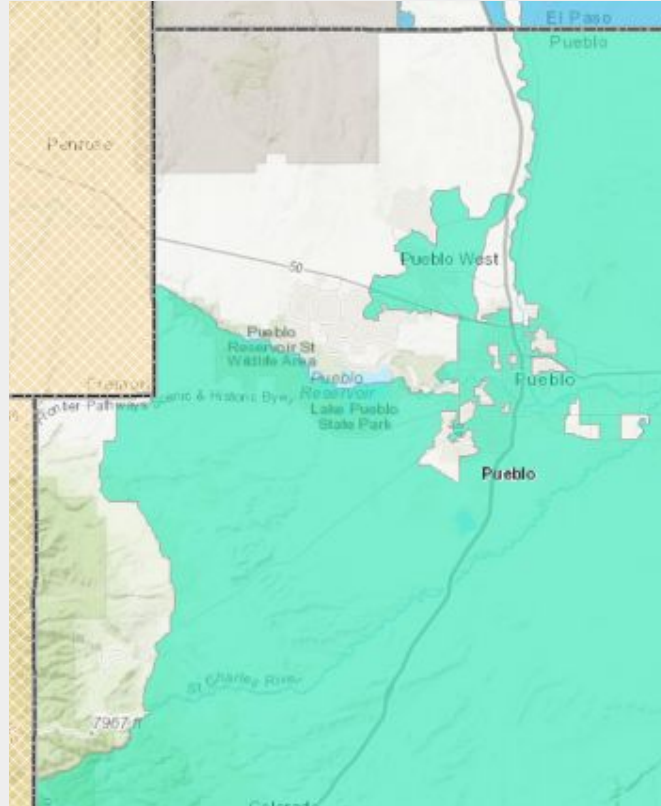
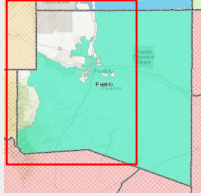


Pueblo County Enterprise Zone

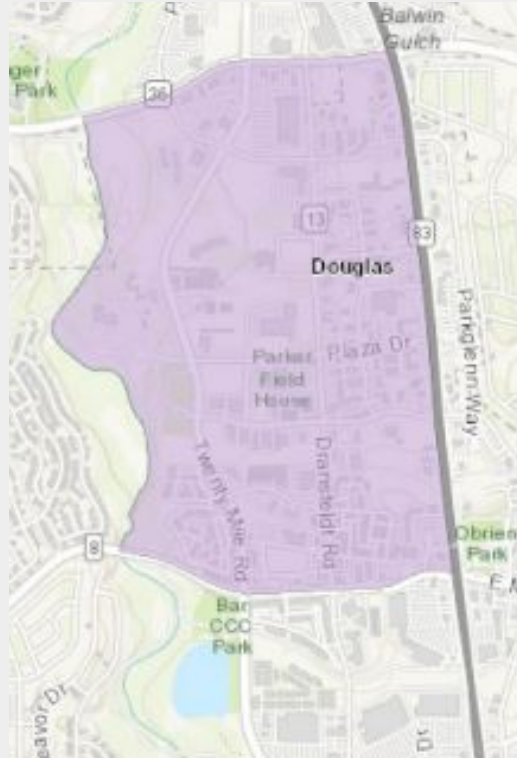
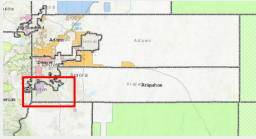
The South Metro EZ includes designated business districts within the cities of Englewood, Littleton, Sheridan, and the Town of Parker.

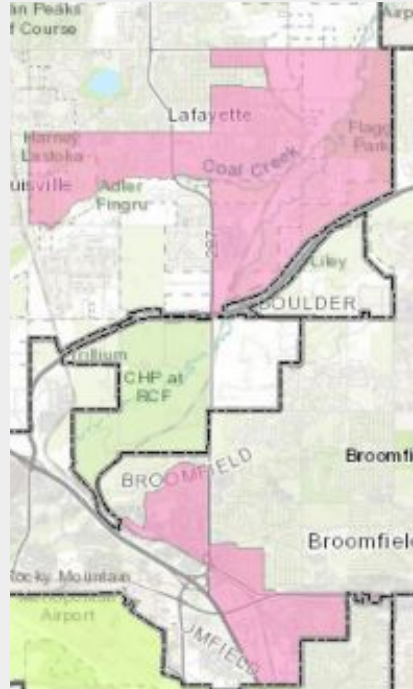
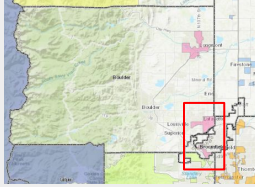
The North Metro EZ includes portions of Broomfield, Lafayette, and Longmont.

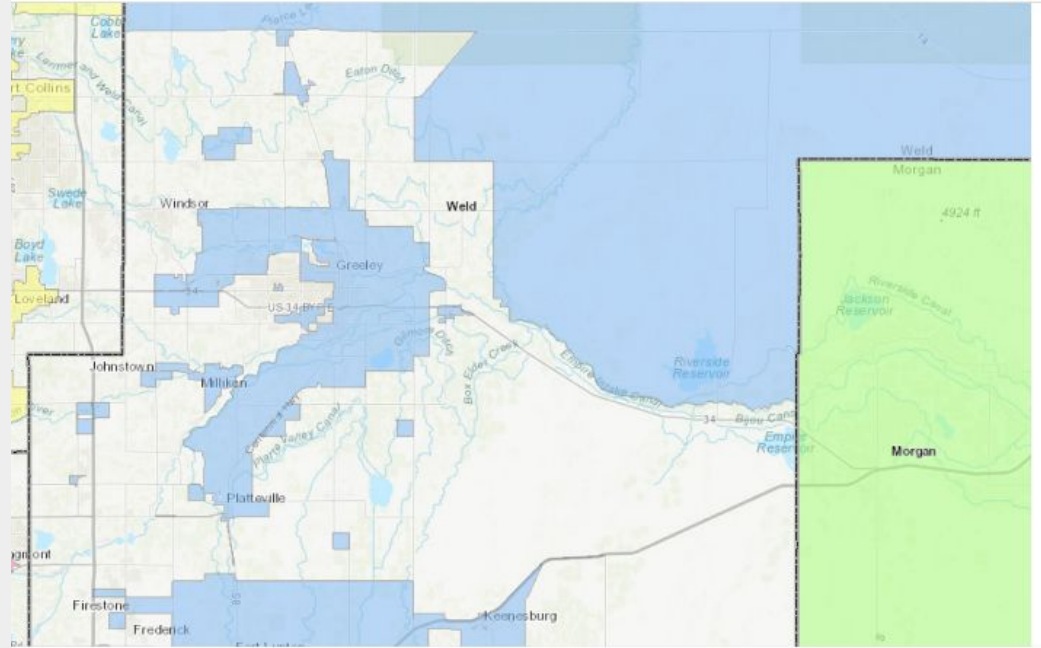
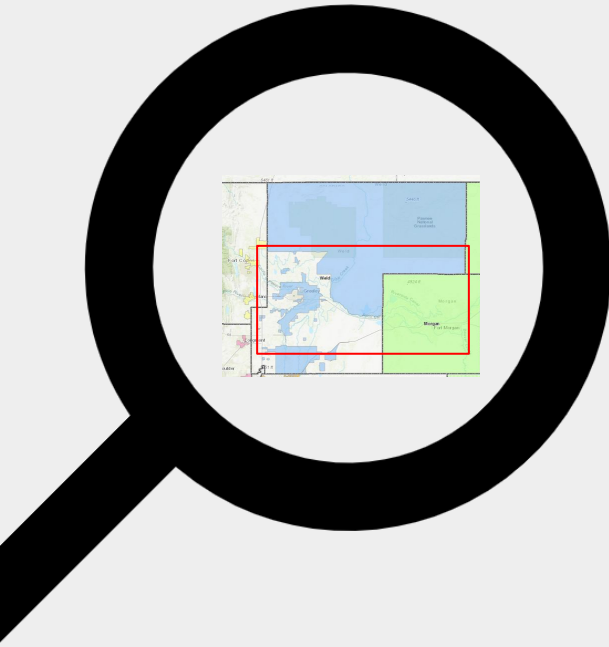
The Weld County EZ includes the northern area of the county. The EZ also includes portions of the Greeley, Evans, Ault, and Eaton, primarily along the Highway 85 corridor, and portions of Johnstown and Milliken are included along Highway 60. Portions of Berthoud, Mead, Frederick, Firestone, Dacono are included in business locations. The municipalities of Fort Lupton, Gilcrest, Platteville, Kennesburg, La Salle, Garden City, and Hudson are generally included in the Zone.
